that vs which

Please note that generally "that" is used for defining (restrictive) clauses, which are necessary to the meaning of the sentence, while "which" is used for non-defining (non-restrictive) clauses, which add extra information and are usually set off by commas.

- 3. Correct The phrase "which is hanging in the gallery" is an extra, non-essential piece of information, so "which" is appropriate here.

- 5. Correct The phrase "which I bought last year" is an extra, non-essential piece of information, so "which" is appropriate here.

Explanation for the first sentence: The use of "that" is incorrect because the phrase "that I read last month" is non-essential information about the book. The sentence can stand alone as "The book was thrilling". Non-essential clauses should be introduced with "which", not "that", and be set off by commas.
