"Decide" Meaning: To make a final choice or judgment.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Decide (Present Tense): I decide to go to the gym. • Decided (Past Tense & Past Participle): She decided to travel last summer. • Decides (Third Person Singular): He decides to stay home. • Decision (Noun): It was a tough decision. 	<p>Make a Decision</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Example:</i> The team took a week to make a decision on the project's direction.
